Alexander G. Stang - Honored Artist of the Russian Federation, Professor.

Graduated from the Leningrad State Conservatory in 1966, class of Ya. S. Ryabinkov. In 1964, while still a student at the conservatory, he was admitted to the Symphony Orchestra of the Leningrad State Philharmonic. For 14 years

works in the orchestra performed with such famous conductors as K. Elíasberg, K. Zanderling, A. Jansons, N. Rabinovich, G. Karajan, K. Cecchi, P. Argento, P. Berglund and many others. From 1978 to 1995, at the invitation of E. Mravinsky, he worked in the Leningrad Philharmonic Symphony Orchestra as deputy accompanist of the orchestra. As part of the orchestra, he repeatedly toured in many countries of Europe, Asia, America, Japan, etc. From 1983 to 2007 he performed as a member of

State String Quartet named after S.I. Taneyev in the best halls of St. Petersburg, as well as abroad in Holland, France, Yugoslavia, America, etc.

In 1996 he was awarded the honorary title of Honored Artist of Russia. As part of a quartet, ensembles and solo A.G. Stang performed and recorded on records and CDs a large number of works of domestic and foreign

composers. Since 1982 he has been teaching at the St. Petersburg State Conservatory named after N.A. Rimsky-Korsakov and at the secondary special music school. Over the years, he has graduated a large number of specialists, many of whom are laureates and diploma winners of all-Russian and international competitions and work in the best teams in Russia and abroad.
